AVIATION HERITAGE EXCURSION – Dayton, the Birthplace of Aviation

Sites include:

[National Aviation Heritage Park](#) – Learn more about the Wright brothers' innovativeness and tenacity for flight at their cycle company shop as National Park guides introduce you to their workshop and childhood neighborhood. The museum features a film history of the first flight

narrated by Martin Sheen; a parachute museum; and history and works of Paul Lawrence Dunbar, an African American 20<sup>th</sup> century poet who lived and worked with the Wright brothers.

[Huffman Prairie National Historic Site](#) – This is the field where the Wright brothers continued their experimental flights after Kitty Hawk. This location was America's first landing field, first airport, and first flying school. A National Park Service guide will welcome you and tell you about the flight exploits of the Wright brothers on this historic pasture.

[National Museum of the United States Air Force](#) – Explore the history and development of flight. Exhibits include balloons and bi-wing wooden aircraft to missiles, stealth aircraft, and space capsules. Four hangars take you through aviation history and feature aircraft from World War I & II, Korean Vietnam, and the Middle East conflicts.

Experience hands-on exhibits and simulators throughout the museum.

#### [Presidential Aircraft and Experimental Aircraft Hangar](#) –

A separate part of the Air Force Museum, this hangar features the Presidential airplanes of Roosevelt through Clinton. Walk through each cabin and see the various technology and design changes. View many one of a kind aircraft and engines that are the only remaining example of the experimental trials.

\*\* Registration for this part of this tour is required by July 10, 2011. Passengers that are US citizens, need to show driver's license or photo ID.

This is for the Presidential Wing which is on the Air Force Base ground, so they need a record of visitors. Driver's license works for ID. With a passport they usually allow non- US citizens.. Sorry for these details but it is Air Force security. **YOU WILL NEED YOUR ID ON THE DAY OF THE TOUR.**
